Role - Art Teacher (Full Time)

Chiswick House School is seeking to employ a creative, flexible Art Teacher to join our team on a full-time basis for the scholastic year 2022/2023. The Art Teacher's responsibilities will include sourcing art supplies, preparing lessons, and providing appropriate instruction on how to develop art techniques.

To be successful as an Art Teacher, you should be able to encourage creativity and self-expression among students. Ultimately, an outstanding Art Teacher will be attentive and responsive to themes in students' art that suggest distress in their personal lives. The selected candidate should also be able to supervise lessons to ensure that learners interact in a supportive and respectful manner.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Planning and delivering Art lessons in accordance with students' learning objectives.
- Co-ordinate and implement educational curriculum by developing classroom activities based on developmentally appropriate practices and early learning standards
- Preparing the classroom by gathering and setting up equipment.
- Developing students' drawing, colouring, and painting techniques.
- Teaching students about art
- Assigning in art projects
- Recording and reporting on students' progress.
- Ensuring that the classroom is clean after each lesson.
- Monitoring inventory and sourcing art supplies, as needed.
- Attending faculty and parent-teacher meetings.

Skills and experience required:

- Be in possession of a recognised qualification at MQF level 7 or a recognised comparable qualification in the subject/area applied for; and/or
- Be in possession of a recognised qualification at MQF level 6 or a recognised comparable qualification in the subject/area applied for; or
- Be in possession of a recognised qualification at MQF level 6 but not in the subject/area applied for, on condition to being in possession of an Advanced Matriculation Level at MQF level 4 (minimum Grade E) in the subject/area applied for;
- Prior experience as an art teacher will be considered an asset
- Lead by example; encourage teaching team success through modelling and coaching.

- Plan individual and group age-appropriate activities to actively engage children and encourage social, cognitive and emotional growth.
- Demonstrated excellence in a variety of art techniques.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills in Maltese and English.
- Capacity to supervise group and individual work.
- Outstanding planning and problem-solving skills.
- Supportive, flexible disposition.
- A valid and clean Police Conduct Certificate / background check (POMA).
- Good references.
